A more inclusive and accessible Erasmus

- boosting mobility of school pupils, VET learners and young people
- flexible activity formats, such as short term, group mobility
- adapting the grant levels for certain mobility actions
- blended mobility, virtual exchanges and virtual cooperation making full use of digital innovations
- Small-scale partnerships for newcomers and grassroots organisations working directly with people with fewer opportunities



A broader and forward looking Erasmus

- •targeted mobility in strategic, forward-looking fields
- •New ambitious formats of cooperation, such as European Universities, Centers of Vocational Excellence and Partnerships for Innovation
- Introducing mobility in the field of sport and
- •... in support of other policy areas (green Erasmus, entrepreneurs, public sector, etc.)



A more participatory Erasmus

- •Supporting new actions to empower young people to participate more actively in society-Youth participation
- •Bringing participants closer to the local communities
- ErasmusAlumni
- •Launching new opportunities for young people to learn about and discover Europe through travelling – DiscoverEU
- •Promoting knowledge and awareness of the EU and its common values to a wider audience Jean Monnet



A more international Erasmus

- Boosting international mobility and cooperation
- •Extending international dimension to new sectors, such as vocational education and training
- •Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees for European students at international level
- •Erasmus international complemented by EU external instruments

A simpler Erasmus

- Lighter application forms
- Use of the "Charters" for mobility projects
- •Shorter reports
- Improved on-line tools
- •Less administrative requirements for beneficiaries
- •Further improve the use of simplified grants (e.g. use of lump sum for small scale partnerships)




